I have several areas of research interest. The two major ones are the anxiety and the personality disorders. I am interested in the longitudinal course of personality disorders, the relationship between the personality disorders and the anxiety (and other Axis I) disorders, the diagnosis of personality disorders and how personality disorders affect the outcome of treatment of other disorders (both emotional and physical.) I am also interested in what influences outcome of the anxiety disorders.

Upon entering private practice and having published on available data sets I had collected in academia I have focused on thinking and publishing articles on the above area (please see significant publications below.) I no longer have the ability to collect new data and to my knowledge there are no such a data sets available to me to analyze.

I have also an interest in disability issues in psychiatry which is an area of my practice although at this point have not published much empirical work in this area.
